Adopt 812-020-0071 to allow continuing education hours earned as a residential contractor to apply toward commercial continuing education credits.

Adopt administrative rules in Chapter 812, Division 21. Adoption of proposed rules is necessary to establish and administer the continuing education program under ORS 701.126, which applies to residential contractors. In 2007, the Oregon Legislature enacted ORS 701.126. Proposed rules needed include, but are not limited to:

- Defines terms in the rules adopted to administer ORS 701.126.
- Establishes the date on which the rules take effect and the date on which the rules will first be applied to renewing residential contractors.
- Outlines the requirements for residential contractors to comply with ORS 701.126, defining number of hours required CORE areas and elective hours.
- Outlines requirements for licensees to maintain records of CE participation.
- Establishes the requirements when license is inactive.
- Establishes the rules for continuing education requirements when there has been a lapse in the license.
- Establishes provider approval, standards, and fees for CORE training.
- Establishes course approval, standards and fees for CORE training.
- Establishes tracking of hours.

In 2007, the Oregon Legislature enacted ORS 701.126. Proposed rules needed include, but are not limited to:

 - Establishes the requirements when license is inactive.

Fiscal and Economic Impact, including a Statement of Cost of Compliance:

The rule changes have no known fiscal impact on state agencies, units of local government or the public.

No state agencies or local governments are likely to be affected by the proposed rule.

The rule changes will not increase the cost of a new single-family dwelling.

Statement of Cost of Compliance:

2. Cost of compliance effect on small business (ORS 183.336):

These rules will affect all residential or dual endorsed CCB licensees.

- b. Projected reporting, recordkeeping and other administrative activities required for compliance, including costs of professional services: See estimates below.
- c. Equipment, supplies, labor and increased administration required for compliance: See estimates below.

CORE training is a combination of 3 hours of Building Exterior Shell Training (BEST); 2 hours of building codes or green or sustainable building practices; and 3 hours of laws and regulations. Training providers will be able to train on BEST, building codes, and green or sustainable building practices. CCB will provide the laws and regulations portion of the training required. There will also be elective courses offered by training providers.

Training Provider application fees:

- \$2,000 per application to perform BEST training
- \$500 per application to perform Codes training
- \$50 per course hour offered

Residentially Endorsed Contractors—the following are estimates of costs:

- Estimate First two-year period 8 hours of CORE and 8 hours of electives—total of 16 hours
- Second two year period 5 hours of CORE and 11 hours of electives—total of 16 hours.
- We estimate the cost per credit hour at \$75.
- \$75/hr x 16 hours = \$1,200 per two year license period.

How were small businesses involved in the development of this rule?

Six of the current nine Board members are business owners.

Small businesses were involved in developing the rule. One member of the three-member subcommittee that helped develop the rule is an owner of a small business. Small businesses are represented on the Board of the CCB, which ultimately adopts the rule. The Board also has a Continuing Education Committee (CES) that hold meetings, invites the public and develops the proposed rules regarding continuing education.

Administrative Rule Advisory Committee consulted? The Construction Contractors Board is made up of six contractors; one elected public official, and two public members. They serve as their own Administrative Rule Advisory Committee. The Board also has a Continuing Education Committee (CES) that hold meetings, invites the public and develops the proposed rules regarding continuing education.
